Hello my name is Allan. I am now 25 years old. I used to live at home with my mum, my dad and my sister.

I moved into Sunnyside house just over a year ago. When I came to Sunnyside I did not talk to anyone. I had chosen not to speak for 7 years and it became comfortable not to speak.

I used to write things down, nod or shake my head and use eye contact to communicate with the staff that work at Sunnyside. I learned new skills such as being able to eat with a group of people and socialise.

After the first few months at Sunnyside

I was able to mix with people every day and for the first time in my life I felt I had real friends. My favourite person at Sunnyside is Elisabeth.

The staff at Sunnyside helped me get a job at an animal sanctuary as I loved cats but I didn't enjoy it as much as I thought I would. I now have a Voluntary role at Aveley Football club once a week where I am able to help out cleaning.

A word from our founder...

Hi I am Andrew, I opened Sunnyside House in September 2008 to give young adults with learning disabilities a better opportunity to become independent in a fun, secure and safe way to realise their dream of managing as much of their own lives as possible. Too many disabled adults we spoke to had either not coped well in independent living or knew someone who hadn't and this needed addressing. I designed a social, communal setting with a professional independence programme, a step down training flat and a highly motivated, enthusiastic team and together we are going to realise our vision.

My team and I use the life formula:

HAVE = BE X DO

Lets start with what we "HAVE", this is our Vision:

"To Be Recognised As The Leading Provider For Preparing Adults With Learning Disabilities To Have A Sustainable, Independent Life"

We want to be the best, this is what we want to "HAVE" In order to have this, what we "DO" will help get us there, Mission:

To Create A Service Model Designed To Prepare Young Adults With Learning Disabilities For Independent Living That Is:

- Sustainable
- Personalised
- Innovative

Allan's story continued...

I am happy to be able to help at the club as everyone knows me there. I enjoy watching football and they gave me a season ticket to watch all the home matches.

I pay my bills with help from my key worker, I go to the Gym with my friend Gavin every week and I can go by bus and train to appointments.

We go shopping in the local area and also at Lakeside Shopping Centre. My week is busy with social activities at clubs, cinema, bowling and going out with my friends at Sunnyside.

I had my first holiday with my new friends at Sunnyside at Havens holiday Park at All Hallows in Kent. We went with four of the staff members and four of the Service Users. It was great.

The staff at Sunnyside helped me in 1:1 sessions to set targets of when I would like to speak again and I did on 19th November 2009. The staff helped me by encouraging me to practice on the Karaoke machine and the Singstar game. At first I made noises and did not join in with the singing. This helped my confidence in hearing my voice again. At first I was scared to speak to anyone else outside of Sunnyside but now I am now able to talk to everyone and my confidence has grown in knowing I am understood.

My hope for the future is to learn more living skills to help me live as independently as I can. Sunnyside house is a fun place to live, I like having my friends around me and I am looking forward to starting paid employment. I am very happy with my life.

We are delighted to announce that we were recently granted planning permission for our independence training flat, which is going to be built in the very near future next to Sunnyside House.

We are very excited about this news (as are our service users) as it means they will have the next step of our independence programme in place.



The flat will consist of two bedrooms, lounge and bathroom. Service users in the flat will be supported by our team but will have the opportunity to test their independence skills in a real live environment before moving on.

Gavin's story

I would like to introduce myself, my name is Gavin and I am 22yrs old.

I moved into Sunnyside House just over a year ago. I had previously been in care homes and supported housing but these placements had not worked out, mainly due to my need to learn more daily living skills.

Since I have been a service user at Sunnyside I have learnt to cook good, healthy meals. My favourite meal to cook is Spaghetti Bolognese and I am able to be the chef on the days I cook for all the people I live with. Other skills I am developing are my cleaning and house keeping skills. I am now very confident in cleaning the communal areas and I can keep my room to a high standard.

Being able to budget and manage money is important so I go to the shops and buy items for the house to learn how to have the right money and change. This helps me when I go to the pub on a Friday night where I have a couple of beers. I go on my own as I know lots of people in the pub. Sometimes my friend Catherine comes with me although she only likes to drink coke. Catherine is my best friend at Sunnyside and we get on so well together.

At Sunnyside we have a games room, which everyone loves. We can play pool and get onto the computer to do emails and learn new skills on the Internet.

Since I have been at Sunnyside I've learned to travel on the bus and I know all the routes. I can go to Lakeside and Grays independently and I am hoping to be able to go to Tilbury and Romford in the near future.

We do some activities as a group, like bowling, cinema, theatre, and we have also been up to London to The British Museum. The staff help us to achieve things we like to do and also help us to learn to be independent for the future. Then I hope to get paid employment. I have been working hard to take my C/V's to local employers at Lakeside in shops like Primark, Marks and Spencer's, Take away and food outlets. I am hoping to hear back from them soon.

I enjoy living here but look forward to moving into the new 2 bedroom flat being built at Sunnyside this year. This will help me become more independent and practise living on my own with less support. Sunnyside has helped me to achieve lots of new experiences and I look forward to the year ahead.


